


Bunny and Eggs Guided Drawing


To Make A Bunny From the Front:

1. Draw a heart, and then turn the paper upside down. This will be the body of the bunny. If your students don't know how to make a heart, then have them draw a circle with a pointy top, and that will also work.
 2. Draw an ear on the bunny by making a long, skinny capital C on top of his head. Then make another one on the other side of it to close the ear. Draw a little squished hot dog for the inside of the ear.
 3. Draw the second ear in the same manner as the first, unless you want it to be hanging down differently, etc.
 4. To draw a foot, make a rainbow near the bottom of the body. Make a lid (close it) by putting a line across the bottom. Then add some claws as shown.
 5. Do the same to make a second foot.
 6. To draw the mouth: draw a capital J "without a hat" under the nose on one side, and then draw another one backwards on the other side. Then add optional rectangle teeth by making a number eleven for each tooth, and then putting a "lid" on the bottom of it.
- Note: This bunny is designed to be very simple, so there are no arms on it.




To Make A Bunny from the Back:

1. Draw an oval. This will be the bunny's body and head.
2. Draw an ear on the bunny by making a long, skinny capital C on top of his head. Then make another one on the other side of it to close the ear.
3. Draw the second ear in the same manner as the first, unless you want it to be hanging down differently, etc.
4. To draw a foot, make a rainbow near the bottom of the body. Make a lid (close it) by putting a line across the bottom. Then add some claws as shown.
5. Do the same to make a second foot.
6. Draw a cloud (a bumpy circle) for the bunny's tail. I usually tell the children to watch while I make the it and say, "Boing, boing, boing" as I make the bumps around the circle.



To Make A Bunny from the Side:

1. Draw an oval laying on its side as shown. This will be the bunny's body and head.
2. Draw an ear on the bunny by making a long, skinny capital C on top of his head. Then make another one on the other side of it to close the ear.
3. Draw a rainbow over the top of the first ear, as if you were going to draw another ear behind the first that doesn't show.
4. Make a letter U for the front feet. For the large back foot, make a capital letter L with a long stick on the bottom of it for the bunny's foot. Then turn that




stick into a hotdog to form the rest of the bunny's foot. Put a rainbow over the top of it to form the rest of the bunny's hip.

5. Draw a cloud (a bumpy circle) for the bunny's tail. I usually tell the children to watch while I make the it and say, "Boing, boing, boing" as I make the bumps around the circle.

6. Draw the face by making a circle for the eye and the nose as shown and a smile.


To Make Easter Egg #1:

1. Draw an oval for the egg.
2. To make the designs, make capital M's on the top and capital W's on the bottom. (It's fine to tell them that both the top and the bottom are the same letter but I like to mix it up a little bit!)
3. Add some polka dots just for fun!




To Make Easter Egg #2:

1. Draw an oval for the egg.
2. To make the designs on the top, make a small smile on the very top of the egg, and then another small smile underneath that one, etc.
3. On the bottom, make a small frown to get started, and then another larger one over the top of that, and then another, etc.




To Make Easter Egg #3:

1. Draw an oval for the egg.
2. To make the designs on the egg, add some smiles on the top edges of the egg, and some frowns on the bottom edges of the egg.
3. Finish up with some differently sized ovals in the remaining spaces on the egg.



To Make Easter Egg #4:

1. Draw an oval for the egg.
2. To make the designs, draw some snakes across the egg with lots of different colors in any way that you like.



To Make Easter Egg #5:

1. Draw an oval for the egg.
2. Make some wavy lines, like rollercoasters that go up and down or capital S's on their sides. When you color them in, color each section different colors.
